	<p>2007 while President of Boston’s chapter 33, I worked with a talented team to resurrect this non-active chapter. Boston is now one of the largest chapters in the country. As a regional vice president in 2008, I successfully outlined a national CPMM program to the AFE board of directors. Shortly thereafter and with the support of the region 8 board of directors, I developed AFE’s first regional CPMM program. To date this program has trained well over 115 new Certified Plant Maintenance Managers in New England, while grossing over \$104,000. Other regions are currently moving on this initiative.</p> <p>A year earlier in 2007, I initiated a website template for eight of the nine regions of our organization.
